1. FAA Artists in Residence presents Vanshika Khaitan & Megan Murphy, August 5-11

Two local visual artists, Vanshika Khaitan and Megan Murphy, will work on art projects from August 5 to 11 as part of the summer residence series in the Soldiers' Barracks.

Vanshika Khaitan, a student at Fredericton High School who has been teaching art to children for two years, and who sells her art at Isaac's Way, will be creating an acrylic canvas painting of trees. She will also incorporate tree-based materials into the painting and will invite members of the public to contribute other nature-based materials to her painting.

Megan Murphy, also a student at Fredericton High School who was cast as Belle in Theatre New Brunswick's recent production of *Beauty and the Beast*, will be working on a painting of a forest, using a large MDF paint board and bright, acrylic colours. She will depict wildlife and a variety of flora and vegetation to represent the life that trees provide.

The artist residencies, organized by the Fredericton Arts alliance, encourage visitors to interact with the artists.
