Canadian multi-instrumentalist, Dan Walsh is already well known for his collaborations with a number of talented musicians. He's added his bluesy-bluegrass signature style to more than two dozen albums and toured across North America, Europe and Australia. For many years Walsh was a key member of Fred Eaglesmith's band, The Flying Squirrels, where he played more than a couple of hundred gigs a year and shared the stage with the likes of Willie Nelson, Little Feat, Toby Keith, Delbert McClinton, Blackie & The Rodeo Kings, Kelly Joe Phelps, Willie P. Bennett and the Del McCoury Band. Lately he's been playing slide guitar for Diesel Dog.

Now, at long last, we get Walsh solo with Diesel & Smokes (Busted Flat Records), the first release where the spotlight falls on Walsh's instrumental genius. But in true Walsh style, his original compositions with dobro, lap steel and electric, baritone and acoustic guitars (and more) are not at all showy, but understated, moody -- and mesmerizing.

11. Artists Recognized at Arts Achievement Award Reception

Members of Fredericton's arts community have been recognized by the City of Fredericton at the inaugural Arts Achievement Award reception. The event took place at Gallery 78. SilverFish Photography Collective and Brigitte Clavette were presented with the award by Mayor Mike O'Brien and Deputy Mayor Kate Rogers, who also serves as chair of the Arts Advisory Committee.

SilverFish Photography Collective is made up of 12 members, many whom were on hand at the reception, who bring a unique vision and creative talent to the group. The Collective has held exhibits across New Brunswick and have been part of Fredericton's artistic landscape since 2000.

Brigitte Clavette is well known as an artist, educator and active member of the arts community. A highly respected artist, her vibrant, quality work has been recognized with a number of prestigious awards. Her long standing career as head of the metal/jewellery program at NBCCD has resulted in a strong core of artisans working in jewellery and metal.

Other nominees included Charlotte Burhoe, owner of Corked Wine Bar, who regularly promotes art with painting classes, exhibits local artists work and showcases musical talent on a regular basis. Tina LeJeune, owner of Isaac's Way and the Abby Café & Gallery was also nominated for her work in exhibiting local artists, raising funds through the sale of art to support music/art/theatre lessons for underprivileged children.

The recipients were presented with a bronze pin which was created by NB College of Craft & Design student Joël Belliveau, as part of collaboration project with NBCCD metal students. The new Arts Achievement Award program is an action item from the City's 2014 Cultural Plan, and was created to celebrate and recognize the accomplishments and contributions of individuals and groups and the importance of the arts in the community at an annual awards ceremony. 12. Restoration of the Stained Glass Windows at Memorial Hall, UNB

This week the first of the Stained Glass windows of Memorial Hall are being removed and the restoration has begun. Over the next few months, decades of dirt and grime will be removed, the glass will be repaired and the lead will be replaced by "Maitre d' Vitraux" Ned Bowes.

This delicate work requires the rare skills of a specialist and fortunately Fredericton is currently the home of respected stained glass artist and conservator Ned Bowes. Ned has 37 years' experience working on large restoration projects throughout North America and the Barbados, where he maintains a studio in Speightstown and continues his work on the windows of St. Peter's Church. He has worked on the windows of most of the churches in New Brunswick and the historic homes of Fredericton. These include Christ Church Cathedral, Wilmot United Church, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, St. Dunstan's Catholic Church, to name only a few in the local area.

Ned has trained in the studios of the English artist Robert Hunt, and apprenticed under Maurice Larieux in Marc Chagall's studio in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He has worked on windows designed and executed by some of the most renowned glass artists and studios including Guido Nincheri, William Morris/ Edward Burne-Jones, and the Robert McCausland Company. Ned also was a partner in *Shades of Light*, the firm that executed and installed the Molly Bobak "Encaenia" windows in the Edwin Jacob Chapel of Sir Howard Douglas Hall as well as the portrait of former UNB President Colin B. McKay installed in the library of Ludlow Hall. Ned has obtained the degree of "Maitre d' Vitraux" from the American Stained Glass Institute.

1. ArtsLink NB Workshop: *Documenting Your Work*

ArtsLink NB is excited to present the first instalment of this year's skills workshop series on Wednesday, June 21, 2017. The morning session runs from 9am to 12pm, and the afternoon session from 1pm to 4pm in the Fredericton Public Library, located at 12 Carleton Street.

The Start to Finish Skills Workshops, *Documenting Your Work*, aims to give artists hands-on experience with producing professional quality documentation of their works, through affordable or free technology. This two-part workshop will include sound and music recording in the morning, followed by an afternoon of visual documentation for two and three-dimensional work. Topics include: multi-track recording, sound editing, lighting techniques, ideal camera settings, and more. Registrants will have the option to attend one or both parts of this day-long documentation intensive.

- **The morning session** will focus on an overview of affordable software, instruction on recording equipment and much more. (**If you have a field recorder you typically use, bring it to the workshop)
- **The afternoon session** will include a lesson in lighting works, ideal camera settings, tips for recording three-dimensional work, and more. (**If you have access to a camera, bring it to the workshop)

Weave a Market Basket

Basket weaver, Lisa Fullarton, will lead you in creating this very functional hard sided shopping basket with strapping handles. It's a classic carrier you will want to use all the time. If you are on the go with a water bottle, lunch, coffee, a book, etc. this is a great carry all, and nothing will get crushed in transit; the bottom is flat and stable to go behind your seat on the car floor, or on the seat next to you. Your Market basket will be completed and ready to go by the end of day two of this workshop. A finished basket is approximately 11" long x 7" wide and stands about 10" tall. The handles are nylon, so they do not add any height to the item.
