1. FAA's Summer Artists Residencies continues with Katherine Moller & Derek Davidson Jul 3-9

This year, the summer artist residency, run by the Fredericton Arts Alliance, takes place from June 30 through to Labour Day. And this year there is a twist: they will be in Officers' Square, housed in a brightly decorated, solar-powered shipping container. This initiative is known as *Art in the Box*, and will be more visible and more accessible than in previous years. As in the past, they will pair up artists in a wide range of media – all selected by an independent jury to ensure excellence.

Violinist **Katherine Moller** has joined painter Derek Davidson as artist in residence at Officers' Square. Moller plans to reflect on Canada 150 by composing fiddle music in the style of the many cultures which have come to this country and influenced each other over the period since Confederation. **Derek Davidson** is painting the diversity of Canada as he sees it, from the perspective of someone who moved here from Great Britain. The two artists will continue in the *Art in the Box* shipping container in Officers' Square until July 9.

Starting July 10, **Chase Plourde** and **Jennifer Lee Wiebe** will take over the studio space. **Plourde** is a graduating student in fine craft ceramics from the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design who appreciates vintage imagery and playing with narratives on pots. He plans to create tumblers, mugs and plates that represent what Canada means, using images and words from people who visit the studio. He will take their words and images and transfer them onto the ceramic pieces.

Lee Wiebe has spent 20 years working in visual arts and creativity, evolving from formal traditions of painting and drawing toward cultural and political themes. She is working on an interactive/performance-based work called "Thank you for (not) speaking English." She wants to engage people in a discussion over the dominance of English worldwide. She will engage people through signage in English, French Mi'kmaq, Arabic and other languages.

The following week, **Melissa Kennedy** and **Cat Squires** will move in. New Brunswick native, **Kennedy**, has been living in Florence, Italy, for the past few years studying and instructing in sculpture and drawing. She plans to use life casts of real hands that have built and continue to shape Canada. The fired terra cotta hands will represent real people who communicate, help and create, and whose impact endures as the fired clay hands will. **Squires** plans to do digital illustration on her laptop computer, creating pieces with local and national sources. She wants visitors to be involved in the digital work, which will be incorporated into her final piece.

Art in the Box will be open daily from 10am to 5pm, and artists may stay open on evenings when there are special events in Officers' Square. On July 10, potter Chase Plourde and interactive performance artist Jennifer Lee Wiebe will take over the Box for the following week.

Bard in the Barracks' 2017 season concludes this week with *Richard III* in Odell Park, running through July 9.

Shakespeare's history play is the story of the infamous late medieval English king who rose to the throne by brutally eliminating all who stood in his way. Featuring dark deeds, thrilling swordplay, and ghostly visitations in a Game of Thrones-like setting, *Richard III* is staged in Bard in the Barracks' trademark promenade style, which sees the audience immersed in the action and following scenes between different locations in the park.

Richard III will be performed July 2-July 9 at 7:30pm nightly. Single tickets range from \$10-\$18 with discounts for groups and for those with a ticket stub from having attended our production of *The Comedy of Errors*.

4. River Jam 2017: Celebrating Music, the River, and Canada 150 Jul 7

River Jam, a celebration of music along the Saint John River and one of the summer's most fun music events, takes place the evening of July 7 at the Delta Fredericton.

Live music starts on the patio at 4:30pm and ends with a late night jam session inside at DJ Purdy's. On four stages inside and out, there will be 20 different bands performing this year. Set times will be staggered so fans can catch a bit of every set and the music covers all genres: acoustic, easy listening, blues, country rock, and everything in between.

River Jam favourites like the Downtown Blues Band, Mad Mary and Different Folk will also play. This year will see 8 bands new to River Jam like Jon Fidler, Crossroad Devils, Van Lantz, and Frantically Atlantic.

Special Canada 150 components are being added to the event as well! River Jammers or hotels guests that happen to be in the lobby early in the evening can join in on a participatory choir experience. Fredericton's Alex Good and Moon Joyce, organizers of the bi-monthly Just Gotta Sing! will teach the crowd a traditional Canadian song to highlight Canada's Sesquicentennial.

River Jam is also getting music out on the river, offering boat cruises throughout the evening with on board musicians, offering a unique experience for patrons and an opportunity to showcase more local musicians during the event. The event has grown over the years and continues to capture the joy and importance of music on the river.

Each year River Jam performers generously donate their time and sponsors support the event so that all funds raised can be donated to music-related community projects and organizations. Over the last 16 years more than \$80,000 has been donated to community groups, schools, and music events. There is also an annual cash award presented to the winner of the Diane London Award.
