## 1. FAA Artists in Residence presents Craig Schneider & Tracy Austin, July 8-14

Local ceramic artist and teacher, Craig Schneider, and established fashion artist, Tracy Austin, will create art projects as part of the summer Artists in Residence series in the Soldiers' Barracks.

**Craig Schneider**, who has been practicing and teaching his craft for over forty years, most recently at the NB College of Craft and Design, will be creating a series of hand-made bowls inspired by the incantation bowls of the 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> century from the Upper Mesopotamia and Syria area. He will represent prayers and the liberating of the heart/mind wishes towards the healing of self and environment in his work.

**Tracy Austin**, who owns her own fashion line known as *Steampetal*, and whose work will be shown this fall at the Beaverbrook Gallery, will design a fashion sculpture that represents the spirit of the elm tree, using a variety of materials, such as leather, silk, cotton, and wire, to explore texture, depth, and character.

The artist residencies, organized by the Fredericton Arts alliance, encourage visitors to interact with the artists. The studio is open from 10am to 5pm, Monday through Saturday, and from 12pm to 5pm on Sunday. ## Auditions | Call for Artist Submissions & Awards

### 1. Call for Submissions: The Plain Site Theatre Festival

Theatre St. Thomas is proud to bring a new and exciting festival to our campus to kick off our 2019-2020 season. The Plain Site Theatre Festival aims to present new short LGBTQIA2+-centered works on campus to foster LGBTQIA2+ visibility in our theatrical institutions and our public spaces. Using the definition of “visibility” as a prompt, we ask writers to explore what it means to be “visible” in an LGBTQIA2+ context. The Plain Site Theatre Festival will run at locations across the STU campus the week of October 2, 2019.

- Script submissions are open to all current STU students and alumni who identify under the LGBTQIA2+ umbrella.
- Playwrights should be available after acceptance to work on the script with a dramaturge as applicable.
- Scenes must have a runtime between 5-10 minutes.
- Each scene may only contain two actors.
- Scenes must take place in an outdoor location on the St. Thomas University campus, and should use their proposed location in an artistically interesting way and be about the proposed space in some way.
- Scenes must rely on minimal, if any, technical support.

**Important:** Your full name and contact information should appear with the play’s title only on the script’s cover page; the script itself should not include any trace of your name in order to ensure blind vetting. The script’s pages should include the play’s title as well as page numbers. A character list should appear on the script’s first page after the cover page.

Joint auditions for TST’s The Plain Site Theatre Festival and TST’s other fall and winter productions will be held **September 13 and 14 with potential call-backs September 15**. Everyone is welcome to attend auditions.
