1. Fredericton Arts Alliance Artists in Residence Series presents Jasmine Cull & Chelsea MacCormack August 13-19

The FAA presents weekly local artists residencies located in the Soldier's Barracks (on the corner of Carleton and Queen) in downtown Fredericton. This week, the artists are:

- Fibre artist **Jasmine Cull**, who has practiced and taught fibre arts for 20 years, will be weaving sculptural baskets using natural materials. She will give visitors an opportunity to explore her media.
- Multidisciplinary visual artist **Chelsea MacCormack**, who favours natural building techniques, will work on bird houses, using traditional materials such as birch bark, spruce root, and natural stains and oxides. The bird houses will then be painted side by side, connecting them all with a painting of the river.

Scott McAllister (printmaker) and Jasmine Cull (fibre artist) will be on display until August 12. The Casemates are open daily from 10am-5pm Monday to Saturday, and 12pm-5pm on Sundays. Teachers or artists can propose programs that would bring an artist to work in a school with a class of students for an extended period. Normally the projects would run from 15 to 25 hours. Artists can be from any discipline - visual art, music, writing, drama or more. The artists will be paid \$600 per project. The FAA will also cover the cost of approved materials.

Previous projects have included puppetry, mural painting, musical theatre, art history, sculpture, an exploration of the use of wool through the years, and more. The successful applications will be for programs to run in the fall. If artists have a great idea, the FAA can work to find a school that would appreciate the project, and if a school has an idea, we can try to find an artist to carry it out. The general objectives of this program are to encourage students to express themselves and to think creatively and critically through education in the arts. Funding provided for a maximum of \$3,000 per residency.

Applications for residencies occurring in the fiscal year that begins on April 1, 2018 must be received by email no later than September 28, 2018.

Once approved, residencies should end no later than the end of the school year. Only schools may initiate and present proposals with the collaboration of one or more artist.
